# CBCA Celebrates 12 Honorees at Sold-Out Business for the Arts Awards Luncheon 700 Attend Dynamic Event Featuring Diverse Local Entertainment and Artists

Denver - Colorado Business Committee for the Arts (CBCA) recognized 12 honorees at its 2024 Business for the Arts Awards, presented by MSU Denver and U.S. Bank. This sold-out event was attended by 700 corporate, cultural and civic leaders at the Seawell Ballroom, Denver Center for the Performing Arts, as well as livestreamed to attendees. CBCA's largest annual fundraiser and celebration, this event is the only statewide gathering to honor companies and individuals for their outstanding partnerships and engagement with the arts.

Founded in 1985, CBCA has been producing this inspiring, arts-infused event for over 35 years, featuring exemplary honorees and a variety of homegrown entertainers and Colorado artists. CBCA has honored over 200 organizations and individuals in that time.

The 2024 Business for the Arts Awards honorees demonstrate the mutual benefits when arts and business collaborate," said Christin Crampton Day, executive director of CBCA. "These outstanding business and arts partnerships exemplify how art is essential to our lives, strengthens our communities and drives our economy."

The Awards luncheon program was co-emceed by Michelle Griego with CBS Colorado, and Betty Hart with Local Theater Company and Colorado Theater Guild. The program was punctuated with four live performances featuring local artists, sponsored by Moye White. The program kicked off with a performance by Northern Colorado funk/rock/folk band, Graham Good and The Painters. Town Hall Art Center gave the audience a sneak peek musical theater performance of the upcoming Colorado premier of Raisin. The talented all-female Marichi ensemble, Las Dahlias, performed a medley of songs. Bboy Factory closed out the event with a youth hip-hop and break-dancing ensemble.

Before the event, guests mingled at a networking reception, featuring engaging performances by <u>Circus Foundry</u>. - Frasier Life Plan Community partnered with Boulder Museum of Contemporary Art (BMoCA) to establish an extensive, high-quality art program with curated exhibits and a permanent art collection to benefit their senior residents, staff and quests.
- Fuel & Iron Food Hall is a visionary culinary arts hub in Pueblo, Colo., featuring a creative restaurant incubator, apprenticeship program, commissary kitchen, workforce housing units, a visual arts gallery and dedicated public art program.

- <u>Jubilee Roasting Co.</u>, with a mission to "create well and be good neighbors," is dedicated to building community and supporting local creatives, including offering artist studio spaces in their main location in Aurora.
- <u>Klein Makerspace</u>, based in La Junta, Colo., is fostering creativity and innovation for the betterment of their entire community through education, tourism, economic development, inspiration and local pride.
- <u>The Aurora Highlands</u> is a new master-planned community going above and beyond to integrate a substantial, meaningful and accessible public art program that features nationally renowned artists.
- <u>The Underground Music Showcase (UMS)</u> is a three-day music festival in Denver that is strengthening the music sector through thriving wages, mental health, accessibility, career development and harm reduction programs.
